- PROGRESSIVE....He/[She] keeps his/[her] station up to date. It is well-built and efficient. His/[Hers] operating practices is above reproach.
- FRIENDLY.....He/[She] operates slowly and patiently when requested; offers friendly advice and counsel to beginners; kind assistance, cooperation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the mark of the amateur spirit.

BALANCED....Radio is a hobby, never interfering with duties owed to family, job, school or community.

PATRIOTIC.....His/[Her] station and skills are always ready for service to country and community.


