CONSTITUTION OF THE GRANT COUNTY AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

ARTICLE I: NAME OF THE OGRANIZATION

The corparate name of this organization shall be: THE GRANT COUNTY AMATEUR RADIO CLUB, Inc.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

The purpose of this club shall be to accomplish the following to the best of the club's ability: to promote the advancement of amateur radio through the exchange of information and cooperation among members; to promote radio knowledge, fraternalism, and good individual operation practices; to conduct programs and activities intended to advance the general interest and welfare of amateur radio in the community; to provide such public service communications as may be requested by official agencies; and to provide assistance of those desiring to obtain an amateur radio license. The club shall maintain and operate repeater facilities serving Grant County in order to provide emergency communications in Grant County as well as for the general use of licensed amateur radio operators.

The club shall be operated as a non-profit organization. All officers and members shall serve and function without compensation of any kind except for reimbursement of personal expenses incurred on behalf of the club as approved by the membership.

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

All persons interested in amateur radio shall be eligible for membership. Membership shall be in one of the following categories:

- Full Members: Those members who possess a valid FCC amateur radio license and who have currently paid all dues owed to the club. The full member is entitled to all rights and privileges of the organization, including voting and the holding of office.
- Associate Members: Those interested members who may not possess a valid FCC amateur radio license and who have currently paid all dues owed to the club will be designated as Associate Members. The associate member is entitled to all rights and privileges of the organization except voting and the holding of office.

ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS

The following officers of the club shall be elected by the majority vote of the membership and shall form the Executive Board: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Repeater Trustee. Duties of the officers shall be as follows:

A. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Board and all general meetings of the club, enforce the provisions of the club Constitution and Bylaws, appoint special committees, sign all official documents pertaining to the club activities, and perform all other customary duties pertaining to the office of President.

B. The Vice President shall preside over meetings at the decretion of the President, organize club activities such as contests and other functions for the operating benefit of the membership and to advance community interest and activity in amateur radio, promote club and amateur radio through local new media, and perform other duties as assigned by the President.

C. The Secretary shall keep a current copy of the Constitution and Bylaws of the club, keep a record of the proceedings of all meetings, keep an accurate list of all current members, preserve all papers, letters, and documents pertaining to the club (electronic permitting) excluding those charged to the safekeeping of the Treasurer, perform other duties customary to the office of Secretary.

D. The Treasurer shall be responsible of the maintenance and reporting of all financial records of the club, receive and dispense all funds of the club with the approval of the membership, maintain club financial accounts in the financial institution approved by the Executive Board, present the financial records for inspection by the membership during club meetings and submit all financial records for audit at the end of the elected term and at other times as specified by the Executive Board, and complete and submit any financial reports and forms (electronic permitted) required by federal, state, or local governments.

E. The Repeater Trustee (Extra Class Lisence) shall be responsible for the proper operation and maintenance of all club repeater equipment in accordance with FCC rules and regulations and in keeping with the club purposes for such equipment, maintain proper records of all repeater activities and maintenance, appoint and chair a Technical Committee composed of club members assembled for the purpose of accomplishing the maintenance and operation of the club repeater/other equipment. The trustee shall present regular reports to the club members regarding the status of the repeater/other equipment. The Executive Board shall conduct the routine and necessary business of the club in between regular meetings. Meetings of the Executive Board shall be at the call of the President or the request of two (2) officers. All actions of the Executive Board shall be reported to the membership at each scheduled club meeting.

Officers may be removed from office by two thirds vote of the members present at the scheduled meeting held at least seven (7) calendar days following the publishing of such proposed removal.

A proposal to remove an officer must be presented by no fewer than three (3) full members and to any Executive Board Member.

ARTICLE V: ADOPTION AND AMEMDMENTS

This Constitution and Bylaws shall be adopted/amended by a two (2) thirds vote of the members in good standing of The Grant County Amateur Radio Club, Inc who are present at a scheduled club meeting held for the proposed subject. The proposed Constitution and Bylaws shall be considered to have been properly published by having been mailed and/or emailed to the entire list of voting members in good standing of the existing The Grant County Amateur Radio Club, Inc.

ARTICLE VI: CLUB DISSOLUTION

This club may be disbanded or dissolved by a two thirds vote of those full members present at a scheduled club meeting held at least seven (7) calendar days following the publishing of the proposal to disband according to the procedures stated in Article V. If the club is disbanded, any tangible assets remaining, including all monies and equipment, must be donated to a not for profit amateur radio group or club providing public service to Grant County. If no such group exists, the donation will be made to the closest such club within the State of Indiana. Such donation will be made for the express and exclusive purpose of providing emergency communications for a community and not for the personal use by any one individual.

BY LAWS OF THE GRANT COUNTY AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

ARTICLE 1: MEETINGS

Club meetings will be the 4th Tuesday of the month, unless otherwise called by the President or his designated Officers. Special meetings shall be called by the President or by the Executive Board, or upon the request of three full members of the club. All members shall be notified of the special meeting and the purpose for the special meeting by mail or other proper means (includes Email) at least seven (7) calendar days prior to the meeting. Business conducted at the special meeting will be limited to that pertaining to the purpose for which the meeting was called.

All meetings shall be conducted according to the current revision of Roberts' Rules of Order where they are applicable and not in conflict with the Constitution and By Laws of the organization. Club business requiring approval of the membership shall not be conducted at meeting unless at least one Executive Board officer is present.

Voting will be accomplished by polling those members present at the scheduled meeting. Except where otherwise stated in the Constitution and By Laws, for the proposal to pass, it must receive at least a simple majority of the votes cast.

ATRICLE II: DUTIES, ELECTIONS AND OFFICER VACANCIES

All officers shall be elected at the regular meeting scheduled during the month of December and shall take office on January 1st of the following year. Candidates for all officer positions shall be placed on the ballot by a nominating committee which shall be appointed during the regular meeting in October. Additional nominations may be make by the membership at any time prior to the election. No person shall hold more than one officer position at a time. All officers shall serve for a period of one calendar year or for any portion of that calendar year.

Officers must attend a minimum of seven (7) meetings on an annual basis. Failure to attend the minimum seven (7) meetings could result in the removal of the officer by the Executive Board.

In the event the office of an Executive Member becoming vacant, the Executive Board shall appoint a new Executive Member from the remaining club personnel.

ARTICLE III. DUES

Annual membership dues shall be twenty five (\$25.00) dollars for full membership and ten (\$10.00) dollars for associate members for the entire year. (\$5.00 of every full membership shall be escrowed to the Repeater account and be used at the discretion of the Trustee). Any new members joining the organization after July 1st shall pay one-half (½) of the annual dues. (Of which \$2.50 shall be directed to the Repeater account). Dues are payable on or before January 1st of each calendar year. A member who has not paid dues by January 1st could be removed from the active membership list until the full annual dues have been paid.

Dues for additional family members of a full member shall be five (\$5.00) dollars per person, with a maximum of thirty (\$30.00) dollars per household.

A member may be granted honorary, lifetime membership without dues for extraordinary service to the club or the amateur radio community. A maximum of one (1) lifetime membership may be granted each year.

Trustees' dues are waived.

ARTICLE IV: SEXUAL OFFENDER

Any person listed on the State of Indiana's sex offender list, is prohibited membership to the Grant County Amateur Radio Club.

Adoption: The Constitution and By Laws of the Grant County Amateur Radio Club have been approved for adoption effective November 4, 2023.

Changes and Amendments: Changes and amendments to this Constitution and By Laws of the Grant County Amateur Radio Club were approved October 24, 2023 and becomes effective January 1, 2024.
